## **Reading Your Bible 2 Helpful Hints**

### **1). PRAY!**

Before you begin to read your Bible, you might want to pray a simple prayer like this:

"Dear God, as I read this story, help me to hear the things you want me to hear."

Afterwards, you might like to pray something like:

"Dear God, help me to live what I learned from this story."

### **2). ASK QUESTIONS!**

When you read your Bible, it is often helpful to ask yourself some questions like:

What is going on in this story ?

Which character is the most like me?

What does this story tell me about God?

What does God want me to learn from this story?

What things or people should I pray for?

(Sometimes you might have to read through the story 2  
or 3 times

before you can answer all these questions!)

Asking questions like these can help us to become more aware of what God has done for us, what God wants us to hear, how God wants us to live, and how God wants us to pray.
